Film Explores What Happens When Taps Go Dry
STONEWATER currently in production in and around Calgary

Calgary, AB - What would you do if your taps stopped running? What if you discovered on your way to the store to buy some water, everyone else already had the same idea?

What happens when your watershed is compromised?

All sellable water is gone and people are roaming the streets of Calgary with empty jugs.

Dexter, a country boy at heart, and Jenn, an intense local lawyer, remember a friend Matti who has access to source water. Matti lives nearby on a ranch in the expansive southern foothills. When they finally reach the source water they discover that, as a Southern Alberta rancher, protecting your watershed can also be hazardous to one's health.

Join us on a shoot of STONEWATER, as we follow some of the pressures on our water sources through intense drama.

This hybrid docudrama juxtaposes everyday city life with the serious issues surrounding source waters in the Alberta Southern Foothills, and presents an opportunity for Canadian urban audiences to connect the bottle of water with its source.

STONEWATER is a cultural showcase - locally, nationally and to the world, exploring our relationship with water and the issues that need to be addressed to ensure watershed source health for the future. The film sets out to investigate the pressures on Ranchers, their families and their land, while exploring the impacts on source waters, including pollution, land destruction, and habitat loss.
